

# Grid-side energy storage cost per kilowatt-hour

How much does a battery grid cost?

Battery grid storage solutions, which have seen significant growth in deployments in the past decade, have projected 2020 costs for fully installed 100 MW, 10-hour battery systems of: lithium-ion LFP (\$356/kWh), lead-acid (\$356/kWh), lithium-ion NMC (\$366/kWh), and vanadium RFB (\$399/kWh).

What is the 2020 grid energy storage technologies cost and performance assessment?

Pacific Northwest National Laboratory's 2020 Grid Energy Storage Technologies Cost and Performance Assessment provides a range of cost estimates for technologies in 2020 and 2030 as well as a framework to help break down different cost categories of energy storage systems.

What is the cost of energy storage?

For the grid to be 100 percent powered by a wind-solar mix, energy storage would have to cost roughly US \$20 per kilowatt-hour (kWh). This is an intimidating stretch for lithium-ion batteries, which dipped to \$175/kWh in 2018.

How much does gravity based energy storage cost?

Looking at 100 MW systems, at a 2-hour duration, gravity-based energy storage is estimated to be over \$1,100/kWh but drops to approximately \$200/kWh at 100 hours. Li-ion LFP offers the lowest installed cost (\$/kWh) for battery systems across many of the power capacity and energy duration combinations.

How does energy storage impact the grid and transportation sectors?

Energy storage and its impact on the grid and transportation sectors have expanded globally in recent years as storage costs continue to fall and new opportunities are defined across a variety of industry sectors and applications.

How are battery energy storage costs forecasted?

Forecast procedures are described in the main body of this report. Another measure of the relative cost of solar energy is its price per kilowatt-hour (kWh). Whereas the price per watt considers the solar system's size, the price per kWh shows the price of the solar system per unit of energy it produces over a given period of time. Net cost of the system / lifetime output = cost per kilowatt hour

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Looking back thirty or forty years, the costs of both batteries and solar panels have decreased by 99% or more for their base units. Driven by these price declines, grid-tied energy storage deployment has seen robust growth over the past decade, a trend that is expected to continue into 2024.

For batteries, total \$/kWh project cost is determined by the sum of capital cost, PCS, BOP, and C& C where values measured in \$/kW are converted to \$/kWh by multiplying by four (given the assumed E/P ratio of four) prior to summation. Total \$/kW project cost is determined by dividing the total \$/kWh cost by four following the same assumption.
