How do I dispose of a rechargeable battery in New York?

Keep yourself and others safe by following battery disposal guidelines. To get rid of non-alkaline batteries, you can: NOTE: Batteries should be individually bagged or have ends/terminals taped before disposal. All stores in New York State that sell rechargeable batteries or products containing them MUST accept rechargeable batteries for recycling.

How do you dispose of batteries?

You must take batteries to an authorized recycling center, a universal waste handler or a household hazardous waste disposal facility. When you know how to dispose of batteries, you can help the environment. Dropoff sites typically accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. For single-use batteries, you can get a mail-order recycling kit.

Are rechargeable batteries recyclable in New York State?

All stores in New York State that sell rechargeable batteries or products containing them must accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. No purchase is necessary. These types of stores include: Food stores with less than 14,000 square feet are exceptions and do not need to accept batteries. Learn more about throwing out rechargeable batteries.

Can you put rechargeable or lithium-ion batteries in the trash?

DO NOT put rechargeable or lithium-ion batteries in the trash or recycling. These batteries are commonly used in cell phones, laptops, digital cameras, rechargeable household appliances and power tools, and electric bikes and scooters.

Where can I recycle a dead battery?

Call2Recycle is one of the companies that offer mail-in battery recycling kits. The kit comes with a container that you can use to collect dead single-use batteries. When the container gets full, you can mail your alkaline batteries to a recycling center.

Where can I drop off rechargeable batteries?

You can find a store near you to drop off rechargeable batteries. State law requires all stores selling rechargeable batteries or products containing them to accept and recycle the same types of rechargeable batteries sold or contained in their products. You can start a free rechargeable battery collection program for your business.

Because alkaline batteries no longer contain mercury, they can safely be thrown away with the rest of your trash in every state except California. If you want to dispose of less waste or spend less time at the recycling centers, try switching from single-use batteries to rechargeable batteries. ? Kathryn Kellogg. Sustainability Specialist.

Automotive and marine batteries may be taken to the Recycling Center for disposal. NYS has a new Rechargeable Battery Disposal Ban. Beginning December 5, 2011, no person shall knowingly dispose of rechargeable batteries as solid waste at any time in the state. (NYS ECL § 27-1805)

It is illegal to discard rechargeable batteries in the garbage or regular recycling. In New York State, most stores that sell rechargeable batteries, including pharmacies, and office supply and hardware stores, will accept them free of charge. Ask for the "Call2Recycle box". Businesses that sell new lead-acid batteries for vehicles must accept batteries for recycling. Businesses that sell to consumers and distributors that sell to retailers must both accept batteries of six or more volts. If batteries are not recycled, they must be disposed of as hazardous waste.
