Inspired by the toys children were making out of the flip-flop debris, Julie Church, the Ocean Sole Founder, encouraged their mothers to collect, wash, and cut the discarded flip-flops into colourful products to sell at local Kenyan Markets as another means of ...

That is how FlipFlop Recycling Company was born. It later became known as Ocean Sole Ltd. Ocean Sole today operates from its Marula Studios office in the suburbs of Karen, with a workforce of over 100 artisans and casual workers. The team transforms the discarded flip flops into gorgeous works of art sold locally and abroad.

Ocean Sole "recycles" flip flops scavenged off the Kenyan beaches into unique fun animal sculptures. This is their new location which is both store and factory.
