Who makes Solo cups?

SOLO's devoted fans post over 400,000 photos a year of their good times with our products, and we plan to continue inspiring that loyalty. 1936: Leo Hulseman founded the SOLO Cup Company, making paper cone cups. 1970s: The Hulseman family expanded the paper product portfolio to include plastic cups - originally in red, blue, yellow, and peach.

Where is Solo Cup company located?

Solo Cup Company is located in Lake Forest, Illinois, and in 2006 had sales of \$2.4 billion. On May 4, 2012, Solo Cup Company was acquired by Dart Container. The world's largest "paper" cup in front of what was once the Lily-Tulip manufacturing company, later Sweetheart Cup Company which was in turn acquired by Solo.

Are solo cups still in business?

These days, though, you might not recognize much about the once-familiar red cups. First of all, there is no longer a Solo Company per se. In 2012, Dart Container Corporation acquired Solo - but its iconic cups still bear the first company's name.

The company makes single-use cups, plates, cutlery, take-out containers, and other similar products, under the Solo, Sweetheart, and Bare brand names. Solo's plastic, paper, post-consumer recycled content, and foam items are sold through retailers and foodservice distributors around the world.

Even if collected separately, only a negligible number of Solo cups make it through the recycling process. This confusion surrounding the recyclability of Solo cups has contributed to a phenomenon known as "wishcycling." People often mistakenly throw non-recyclable items into recycling bins, thinking they are doing the right thing.

SOLO cups have been a staple for households and businesses for over 50 years! Getting their start in 1936 by manufacturing paper cone cups, SOLO grew to be a household name when they introduced their iconic plastic SOLO cups in the 1970s.
